OPENING STATEMENT OF RANKING MEMBER GARY C. PETERS March 5, 2020 AS PREPARED FOR DELIVERY

Whether your response is timely and effective will truly be a matter of life and death. With that in mind, I appreciate you joining us today to give my constituents in Michigan and the American people clear answers to the pressing questions they have about this virus.
