Since 2011, congressional and executive actions to implement GAO recommendations have resulted in \$667 billion in cost savings and other financial benefits for the government and taxpayers. This includes more than \$71 billion in the past year alone.

I am committed to working in a bipartisan way to eliminate duplication, overlap, and fragmentation to save taxpayer dollars and improve outcomes for the American people, and I look forward to continuing to work with Ranking Member Romney and my other colleagues to review these recommendations and develop ways to implement them.
