## Dear Secretary Rubio:

Pursuant to the authority under Senate Rule XXV of the Standing Rules of the Senate and Senate Resolution 94, Section 12, I write to request documents and information regarding the revocation of the federal security detail for former Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and former State Department special envoy for Iran Brian Hook. These former federal officials received security details because they were the subject of threats from Iran.<sup>2</sup>

I request the following documents and information as it pertains to Mike Pompeo and Brian Hook:

- 1. All intelligence or information (including but not limited to finished intelligence products or raw intelligence, either classified or unclassified) from any time regarding threats against each of these individuals;
- 2. The reason for revoking the security detail for each of these individuals;
- 3. The federal government's assessment of the threat against each of these individuals before it made the decision to revoke the security detail, at the time it made the decision to revoke the security detail, and after it made the decision to revoke the security detail; and
- 4. All communications with each of these individuals regarding their security details from January 1, 2024, through the present.

The Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs is authorized by Rule XXV (k)(2)(B) of the Standing Rules of the Senate to investigate matters that aid the Committee in "studying the efficiency, economy, and effectiveness of all agencies and departments of the

Government."<sup>3</sup> Under Senate Resolution 94, Sec. 12(e), of the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress, the Committee is authorized to review "the possible existence of fraud, misfeasance, malfeasance, collusion, mismanagement, incompetence, corruption or unethical practices, waste, extravagance, conflicts of interest, and the improper expenditure of Government funds."<sup>4</sup>

Please provide this information as soon as possible, but no later than March 20, 2025. In addition, please provide a briefing on the requested information by no later than March 27, 2025.
