Dear Mr. Secretary:

As part of the Subcommittee's ongoing oversight of Army contracts, I am writing to request information and documents regarding the Army Recruiting Assistance Programs.

Between 2005 and 2008, the U.S. Army, U.S. Army Reserves and National Guard Bureau entered into contracts with Document and Packaging Inc. (Docupak) for the administration of Army Recruiting Assistance Programs (A-RAP), a recruitment program that aimed to increase Army, Army Reserve and National Guard participation through monetary incentives. On February 9, 2012 you discontinued the program due to reports indicating that up to \$92 million may have been distributed fraudulently to Reserve and Guard recruiters.

I understand that you ordered an inquiry into fraud in A-RAP on the same day that the programs were cancelled. The Subcommittee has learned that this inquiry will cover topics including the conduct of military personnel directly involved in the alleged fraud, Docupak's oversight of A-RAP, and the Army's oversight of the contract and program.<sup>3</sup>

I request that the Army provide the investigation report regarding A-RAP to the Subcommittee as soon as possible If the report has not yet been completed, I request that you provide a scheduled date for the report's completion and release by **no later than Wednesday**, September 25, 2013. I also request that you provide a briefing for the Subcommittee following the completion of the report. This briefing should include information regarding Docupak's
