Dear Mr. Secretary:

I am writing regarding recommendations made to the State Department by the State Department Office of Inspector General (State OIG) regarding the contractor DynCorp.

Since 2004, the State OIG has published 18 reports related to contracts with DynCorp. The State Department has concurred with many of the State OIG's recommendations in these reports, although the State Department has also disagreed, raised significant concerns, or failed to respond to other recommendations.

To ensure that the State Department has taken adequate steps to ensure that its contracts with DynCorp are adequately managed and overseen, I request that you provide details of the status of the State Department's progress in regards to the following recommendations:

- 1. In coordination with the U.S. Department of Defense, collaborate the development of Departmental guidance for conducting complex transitions from one agency or entity to another;²
- 2. Identify and return to the Defense Department the amount of Afghanistan Security Forces Fund appropriations that were improperly obligated and spent on other programs, and develop

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and implement procedures to ensure that the Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL) obligates funds appropriately;³

- 3. Ensure that the contracting officer for the Civilian Police (CIVPOL) contract strengthen existing internal controls over contract administration, oversight, and financial reporting;⁴
- 4. Request funds from DynCorp for any costs determined by the Defense Contract Audit Agency as not allowable, allocable, or reasonable under the CIVPOL contract;⁵
- 5. Develop, implement, and document adequate controls to ensure that INL uses Defense Department funds for specific purposes.⁶

I also request that you provide documentation to support the disagreements that the State Department had with the following OIG recommendations:

- 1. Return \$1.5 million of Defense Department funds that were outside the scope of the Defense Department-State Department reimbursable agreement;⁷
- 2. Return to the Defense Department and properly record \$3.99 million of unobligated funds.⁸

I request that you provide the status of these recommendations and the documentation to support your disagreement, as well as a briefing to Subcommittee staff to discuss these issues. I
